CYANOTYPE PRINTING

Supplies List

Learn to print with the sun, using a vintage photography technique. Cyanotype printing was developed in the 1840s as a process to develop photographic images and blueprints. Today it's used for making stunning blue and white artwork. Harness the power of the sun to make prints on cotton and silk fabrics in this hands-on session, participants will learn the basics of cyanotype printing, including preparing the chemicals, coating fabric and creating unique compositions using found objects, masks and stencils. Discover tips, hints and variations for this art form at the intersection of art and science. Beginner to advanced.

Supply List:

Spray bottle of water

An apron or smock

Plastic drop cloth, cut into approx. 2" x 2" pieces

Dishpan

Leaves, flowers, lace, stencils to use as masks (thin and flat items will be perfect, some will be available in class).
